

Meditation for the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Liturgically, we arrived at the first week of Ordinary Time this year on January 9th. And so this Sunday ushers in the second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. Many of the gospel readings will be taken from Mark's version of the Good News. Mark's gospel is the oldest and shortest of the four canonical gospels. Mark writes his good news with simplicity, power, and directness, emphasizing Jesus as the suffering servant, the Messiah, the Christ of God. Nevertheless, the gospel reading today comes from the 4th Gospel, and as such, the immediacy of Mark is amplified by John's version of the psychological impact of Jesus' call to discipleship.

The underlying theme of today's reading illustrates the importance of hearing the message of Jesus' invitation to follow him, to be united to him bodily as temples of the Holy Spirit. In other words to hear the inviting words of Jesus to come and follow and stay with him is a very special, spiritual interpersonal relationship.

This raises the questions. What are we looking for in Jesus? Are we looking as the disciples were? Is he the problem-solver, a miracle worker? Whatever it is that our hearts are seeking the Lord, the Lamb of God, is present always in the Eucharist inviting us to come and stay awhile with him. Moreover, as the gospel states John the Baptist directs two of his disciples toward Jesus, who invites them to remain with him. Andrew, one of the two, seeks his brother Simon and brings him to Jesus.

If we dare to do so, we, like Andrew, might come to know who Jesus truly is and to be transformed by his presence. This invitation is precisely what happened centuries earlier when the Lord called young Samuel. When Eli, Samuel's mentor understands what is happening, he tells Samuel how to answer. Speak, for your servant is listening. From that day forward, Samuel was a prophetic voice for the Lord in an up close and personal way.

In our yearning to know God, we watch and look and watch for the Lord. Following closely in continuance of the prophetic tradition, John the Baptist, who directs us to the Lamb of God asks a powerful question. What are you looking for? The answer is simple yet complex. Whenever we hear the call of Christ's command to follow as a disciple and to be free to answer/resonate with Samuel. Here I am. In faith and in response to God's love to whom we are united in Christ as his disciples, let us be followers and remain in His presence.
