

Meditation for the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

The Eucharist is essential to life in Christ and is as such an important article of faith. Jesus preaches to those who eat his flesh and drink his blood remain in him and he in them. Therefore, it is through our participation in the Eucharist that we are united most intimately with Christ who is united to God the Father. Just as we need to eat to sustain our bodily life, so also we need to consume the bread of life to sustain our spiritual life with Christ. Today's first reading from the Book of Proverbs expresses the importance of food and drink to sustain us. The psalmist provides us to eat and drink to nurture ourselves physically and to understand God's purpose for us - to taste and see the goodness of the Lord. Today's second reading is a practical and theological recognizing of the physical connection between food and drink so that we may come to know the words of Jesus when he says by eating and drinking his body and blood we are obedient to the will of God. The Eucharist is pivotal for us to fulfill and make every effort to understand the physical importance of food and drink as well as to understand what the wisdom of God plans for us to do by faith in the Eucharistic celebra-

The OT notion of wisdom encourages us to understand the values of eating and drinking; and the second reading from Ephesians advises us to live carefully and wisely. The table fellowship of receiving Jesus as the true food and true drink is the ceremonial custom and remembrance of Passover by receiving the body and blood of Christ as a thanksgiving. Thus, the Church as the people of God remember and understand the Eucharistic meal not only as a memorial of the past (the passion) of the Christ, but also as a foretaste of the future (the full coming of God's kingdom).

The blood and wine that has come down to us from heaven sacramentily reminds us that unlike our ancestors who ate and still died will live forever through Jesus the bread of life. In the heat of summer we remember Israel hungering and thirsting in the desert. The gift of manna protected them from starvation but not from death. Therefore Christ who is the bread from heaven leads us to live wisely and practically according to God's law so that in Christ our Eucharistic Lord we may live forever. In conclusion the Eucharistic sacrament is God's method for enabling us to receive God who remains with us. Without Jesus we are void of the gift of eternal life, but remaining in Christ invites us to fulfill God's plan to be one with the Father and the Son. The Eucharist therefore is the summit and source of God's desire to fulfill the divine plan in Christ who is our Eucharist.
