Meditation for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

"Jesus the Son of Man did not come to earth to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" Through service in solidarity with Jesus, we dare not ask the question, "What's in it for me?" Jesus mandates us to find true greatness and self sacrifice by handing ourselves over for the sake of others. In other words, authentic human greatness mirrors the greatness of Jesus.

The theme of today's Eucharistic Celebration, the Mass, illustrates a threefold understanding and application of these themes that are justification by way of suffering, baptism by way of immersion, and discipleship as an honor rather than an obligatory task. These themes clearly indicate or at least should indicate in our lives of faith the avoidance of private agendas.

Jesus never turned away from the reality of suffering. In fact he raises the question how can we suffer with sympathy for others. On the cross, Christ bore our guilt, and his suffering justified the many. When we drink the cup with him - when we carry it with him - we can be sure that his purpose-driven will is being accomplished. By our baptism and immersion in Christ followed closely by our daily ongoing discipleship, we recognize the important presence of God's justification. In this way, we receive mercy and find grace for timely help.

By believing, as of a disciple of Christ, that we are serving God's will for us by in the solidarity of service to the word and realizing daily that the divine grace to live well each day will be "what's in it for us."
