Meditation for the 4th Sunday in Advent Year C

The season of Advent clearly demonstrates that God has a plan for us. But it should also be clear to us that God's ways are different from ours. The Lord God is always faithful to his promises, even when we are all too often lapse in our own faithfulness. As the celebration of Christmas draws near, let us prepare for the Nativity with Mary and her cousin Elizabeth, and let us join in their witness to the mysterious fulfillment of those divine promises in their lives.

From a barren elderly woman, John the Baptist will be born, and in a small, insignificant place Christ our Savior shall come forth. Moreover, through the blessed fruit of Mary's womb, we are consecrated through her offering by the body of Jesus Christ once and for all. In the infant baby, God reaches to the ends of the earth. In these final days of Advent, the closeness of the pregnant Mary makes us leap like John the Baptist in his mother's womb. Lord, let us see your face, and we shall be saved. Through these words, we know that in Blessed Mary's maternal presence, our prayer is being answered down through the ages.

Our Savior, who "shall be peace" comes to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord: "Behold, I come to do your will." (cf. Hb 10). The second reading's author writes that Christ came into the world as the Son to do God's will and so by that all will be consecrated through the offering of Jesus Christ on his Cross and by his Resurrection.

In our darkened world, let us place our trust in the promised Son of Justice, whom we prepare to celebrate and remember with joy. From Bethlehem in Judah comes our King. Honored among the clans of Israel arises a Ruler and Savior, thus fulfilling God's promise. Come, O Lord, reward your people's hope. Grant us the faithful patience of Elizabeth, the faithful witness of John the Baptist, and the steadfast love of Mary.
