A Spiritual Meditation for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C

It is often said that God will give us the most loving answer to our prayers. Sometimes that means that God will physically heal us or grant us some favor. Yet at other times, looking for answers means that ultimately God will meet us on the cross. To this end in the first reading, Qoheleth the teacher recognizes and reminds us that there is not just one way of looking at things. In other ways, it is vanity to allow earthly pursuits to delay building a life of discipleship. Moreover, Qoheleth challenges the conventional wisdom of his day to be counter-cultural by suggesting that in spite of the importance of toil, this pursuit of the necessity of what is necessary and good in life, the Lord also reminds us not to fall into the trap of allowing work to become the sole source of our lives.

Life's richness, then, consists in seeking the God who is above, thus claiming that we receive through Christ, who promises us. Life's treasure lies in claiming via our baptismal commitment, that following Jesus, our life, the way, the truth, and in our daily lives to seek what is above, where Christ is.

As the Apostle Paul exhorts that faith is therefore an act of trust. The Creed professed every Sunday at Mass is a statement of belief. Moreover, the creed is an affirmative statement. It does not say, "I believe the following things about God." It does say, "I believe in God." In other words, we are telling God that we trust in him.

As a pastoral reflection - Who are some people in our personal lives whom we might call examples of faith? Who has taught me to trust even when this sounded all but impossible?

Let us remember the words of Jesus, who says the only treasure that sustains importance is the treasure that we will receive in heaven.
