A Spiritual Meditation for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C

The readings this Sunday speak of the end of the world. The idea of the day of the Lord's coming into the world is to establish a reign of justice. And both the first reading and the gospel emphasize that the end of the world is at hand. "Stand erect and raise your hands because your redemption is at hand." (cf Luke 21,28) This does not mean that we should abandon our daily efforts to live the gospel of Jesus. Moreover, as we are living in the end times, the resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the beginning of the end times. As Christ himself did so, also do we give testimony to his return.

We must be careful, however, how we interpret passages from scripture written with an apocalyptic / end times rhetoric. The most important fact of apocalyptic literature is that the present age is coming to an end through a powerful intervention from God. Furthermore, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ calls us to be confident in his provident care of us. "Not a hair on your head will be destroyed." (cf Luke 21,19) And so Micah the prophet predicts, "there will arise the son of justice with its healing rays."

God has given us new life in Christ who gives us courage to persevere by faith in God's plan for us. And so, by our perseverance, the end is also secure, knowing certainly that God does not abandon us.

Persevering in hope, the second coming of Christ epitomizes the end times and the continuance of God's mercy. In other words our God of judgment blesses everyone who waits for him. We do well here and how to be attentive to the avoidance of sin and to be attentive to take the opportunity to repent.

Finally, the second coming of Christ can be frightening to ponder, but it will also be predominantly a hoped-for time of restoration, a longing for fulfillment in God's commonwealth of the heavenly kingdom. Meanwhile, then, let us persevere in faith when Christ returns. Moreover, as we await the day of the Lord's return, let us become conscientious to fulfill our Christian obligations of justice and mercy.
