A Spiritual Meditation for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

The first reading is one of the songs of the suffering servant of the Lord. The servant with whom Jesus identified became a distinctive, somewhat iconic image of the promised Messiah. The passage from Isaiah does clearly emphasize that this unidentified figure has been chosen and not to address only the needs of Israel. Rather, his is a mission to the nations. This term the nations is the phrase used by the Jews for the pagans who surrounded them and so often threatened their very existence.

The servant is to be the light of the world to all people. The Suffering Servant is an apt title that Jesus would fulfill when he proclaimed himself to be the light of the world reaching to the ends of the earth as we are all called to be saved.

Paul's first letter of 1 Corinthians written to the sophisticated community of Corinth gives us an indication of the problem with which he is dealing. In only three verses the Apostle often repeats the words Lord Jesus Christ (4x). He does this repetition to make his case that the Corinthian community was not only overemphasizing the role of the Holy Spirit; while they all but denied the absolute importance of Jesus. Thus, by referring to Jesus over and over again he is, reminding the community that Jesus is the summit and source. He is the goal of faith.

Let us resonate with these words: Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will. And again, the Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us. To those who accepted him, he gave power to become children of God. (cf. Jn1)

In the 4th Gospel John the Baptizer, a precursor of the coming of Christ consistently points to Jesus as the Messiah. His words remind us that we are not to use our faith for our own aggrandizement of self-importance, but to believe and behold the Lamb of God! It is here that John's employs word-play. In Aramaic, the common tongue of the Jews, the word for lamb is almost the same as the word for servant. Thus, Jesus Is both lamb and servant, baptized with water and the Holy Spirit. This Baptismal encounter is a sign that Jesus is the one who saves - the person who is coming, ...who ranks before me because he existed before me. John's baptism of the Lamb of God testifies that Jesus is the Son, the suffering servant of God who clearly redeems us.
